Focal Point...

On Friday 26th July, the Opening Ceremony of the 2024 Paris Olympic Games will take place and I am looking forward to enjoying the variety of different sports which an event like the Olympics brings to our TV screens. I'm particularly interested to see some break



dancing, which is being included in the Olympics for the first time.

Tears are often shed at the Olympics - sometimes tears of joy and sometimes tears of disappointment. The athletes have spent hours training and preparing themselves, physically and mentally, but only one person or team can win the gold medal. In some sports, speed matters, but the athletes mustn't be so fast that they make costly mistakes, which result in an increased time, penalties, or worse, disqualification.

In a number of places the Bible describes the Christian life as being like a race. In his letter to the church in Corinth, the apostle Paul writes, 'Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize.' (1 Corinthians 9.24) Christians are to live their lives for Jesus with the same determination as an athlete going for gold.

In a world full of distractions - everything from our phones to worrying about what other people think of us - Christians are called to put Jesus first in all things, knowing there is nothing better than a relationship with Jesus. If we find our identity in our achievements, when things don't work out, we can be left wondering who we are or questioning our worth. If we put our trust in Jesus, we are loved and have value, not because of anything we've done or achieved, or will do or will achieve, but because of what Jesus has done for us.

It is 100 years since Eric Liddell famously won gold in the 400m at the 1924 Paris Olympics, despite this not being Eric's preferred event. The heats for the 100m fell on a Sunday and, for Eric, Sunday was the Lord's day - he would not compete on a Sunday. Instead, Eric competed in the 400m, which took place on a weekday, and he won. The film Chariots of Fire is based on this true story. Eric believed his running ability was a gift from God and when he ran, he ran for God, delighting in the gift God had given him.

As we enjoy a summer of sport, I wonder if we might reflect on our purpose in life, the race we're each running, and ask the question: what are we running for?

Many things don't deliver on their promises, but God does - the invitation of the Christian faith is the invitation to a loving relationship with Jesus that will last for eternity. This really is the best prize.





British Folklore Facts Throughout the Year

As we journey on through 2024, we carry on looking at some of the weird and wonderful British folklore facts and stories from our little island which relate to each month of the year (courtesy of Projectbritain.com), continuing in this month's edition by looking at July and August.





Swan Upping

The census of swans takes place annually during July on the River Thames in a ceremony known as Swan Upping. Swans are counted and marked on a 70 mile, five day journey up the River Thames.

St, Swithen's Day

St. Swithen's Day is 15th July, a day on which people watch the weather for tradition says that whatever the weather is like on St. Swithin's Day, it will continue so for the next forty days.

St Swithin's Day, if thou dost rain, For forty days it will remain. St Swithin's Day. if thou be fair, For forty days 'twill rain nae mair'

Grotto Day

25th July is St James' Day (Also known as Grotto Day). Children used to make grottoes and caves and decorate them with sea shells because the scallop shell is supposed to be the emblem of St. James.

The grottoes were placed outside the homes and the children would sit by them and say:

Please remember the Grotto. It's only once a year. Father's gone to sea. Mother's gone to bring him back, So please remember me.

Whitstable Oyster Festival

The English Oyster season officially begins on St James' Day. Whitstable Bay, on the north Kent coast, is famous for its oysters. It has been associated with oysters for hundreds of years. An old Kentish tradition says that Julius Caesar was drawn to Britain by the Whitstable oysters. On St. James's Day the locals hold an annual oyster festival, an event dating back to at least the early 19th century, when it was the custom for fishers and dredgers to celebrate with an annual ceremony of thanksgiving.



Lammas Day

1st August is Lammas Day, and was Thanksgiving time (Harvest time) in Britain. The name comes from an Anglo-Saxon word Hlafmaesse which means Loaf Mass. The festival of Lammas marks the beginning of the harvest, when people go to church to give thanks for the first corn to be cut.

This celebration predates our Christian harvest festival.

On Lammas Day farmers made loaves of bread from the new wheat crop and gave them to their local church. They were then used as the Communion bread during a special mass thanking God for the harvest. The custom ended when Henry Lammas was also the time for farmers to give their farm workers a present of a pair of gloves. In Exeter, a large white glove was put on the end of a long pole which was decorated with flowers and held on high to let people know that the merriment of Lammas Fair was beginning.

Edinburgh Festival in Scotland

Dating from 1947, the Edinburgh Festival is primarily a celebration of

the performing arts, with live concerts, plays, ballets, operas and other shows.

Royal National Eisteddfod in Wales

The Eisteddfod is an older tradition, revived in the 19th century. It originated as a medieval gathering of bards and minstrels, attended by people across Wales, who competed for the prized chair at the noble's table. Held during the first week of August, it celebrates Welsh arts and culture.

Notting Hill Carnival

The carnival is held on the Summer Bank Holiday, the last Monday in August. It features a colourful procession, elaborate and extravagant costumes, and the music of many steel bands. The carnival originated in the mid 1960s as a way of celebrating and maintaining the cultural traditions of the Caribbean immigrants who live in and around the Notting Hill area.

Age UK Solihull

Local charity, Age UK Solihull, has expanded its offering of clubs and activities for older people in Solihull.

Designed to combat loneliness and promote wellbeing among older Solihull residents, two new weekly lunch clubs and a monthly coffee afternoon have recently begun.

The Land Rover Social Club takes place every Tuesday from 12-3pm at Jaguar Land Rover Sports and Social Club, Solihull B92 9LN. The Hobs Meadow Lunch Club takes place every Thursday from 12-3pm at Hobs Meadow pub on Ulleries Road, Solihull B92 8ED.

The two lunch clubs add to Age UK Solihull's existing weekly clubs at the Marston Green Tavern every Tuesday, Moseley Cricket Club in Shirley every Wednesday, and the Red Lion in Knowle every Thursday. These three clubs all have waiting lists, but the new clubs have plenty of spaces for new members.

The clubs are for older residents of the Solihull borough, and priority is given to those who live alone with no family or other support nearby. The lunch clubs cost £8-10 which includes a hot meal, hot drinks and entertainment and activities. The Wednesday Afternoon

Club costs £3 which includes hot drinks, cake, activities and monthly entertainment.

Age UK Solihull has also launched a monthly get-together called "Welcome Wednesdays", which takes place on the last Wednesday of every month from 2-3.30pm at Eastcote Park Care Home in Barston, Solihull. The charity suggests a voluntary donation of £3 to attend, and hot drinks and cake are provided by Eastcote Park. This is a more informal event where members are welcome to drop in with no commitment to attending every month.

Age UK Solihull's Clubs and Activities Coordinator, Emma Hunter, says, "We are thrilled to have launched these new activities which offer the chance for older Solihull residents to get out and socialise, meeting local people and enjoying entertainment and activities in a warm and welcoming environment. Our aim is to combat social isolation and these new clubs and events are integral to achieving that goal."
